Get to know Ghea – one of the proud JA Alumni from Prestasi Junior Indonesia (PJI)



About Ghea

- Full name: Nyi Mas Gianti Bingah Erbiana
- Commonly known as: Ghea.
- Selected as one of the JA Alumni be featured in the JA Worldwide 100 lives campaign.
- Currently on study leave from PT Krama Yudha Ratu Motor (Mitsubishi Vehicle Assembling Company) in Indonesia, where she serves as Legal Head and Compliance Secretary
- Pursuing master of law (LL.M) at University of California, Davis.
- Will be working in Mitsubishi International Corporation in New York after graduation.

When asked why law in business? Ghea responded:

Getting a law degree and specializing in business and commercial law has been one of my dream. It started to grow since my involvement in JA Company Program with PJI. Since then, I have found a strong connection between business and law. I have learnt that a company is not just about profit but should be an agent of change that promotes ethical behavior and social awareness through its product and social activities. Therefore, in creating such goal, law provides tools in the form of rules and regulation (code of conduct) that has to be respected by the business players.

Sharing her student company experience with PJI...

I joined the student company CEPot'S in 2004 as financial staff in the Department of Finance, and subsequently became President in the following year. During my term of service as President, we have succeeded earning more than 100% profit. Participating in the National Business Simulation, we could not conduct export due to technical problem. We replaced the export activity by creating new opportunities that not only earn profit, but also unleashed our creativities. We produced new products such as fresh nuggets to be sold to the community and held event called "Kebun (Kreativity Ibu dan Anak)" or creativity for Mothers and Children - where we combined the event by holding cooking demo and bazaar for the mothers and drawing competitions for children. Participated by hundreds of participants, the event was extremely successful and became an annual activity of CEPot'S.

PJI's company program impact on Ghea:

The experience gained from PJI's company program has influenced me both professionally and personally. For the first time, I have learnt about leadership and professionalism, which was reflected on the organization's activity. The best moment I had was when I needed to decide alternative solutions as replacement to the failing export activity. At that time, I needed to decide immediately the resource of earning for the company. After discussing with the team, I took the risk by creating an innovative event that was so well received that it became a recurring event of the company since then.

The experience and achievement from the program had also enabled an invitation to law school from the Faculty of Law of University of Indonesia.

Ghea's dreams and aspirations

I have a huge dream of creating a good place for everyone to work, creating not only good products but also good people. I strive to contribute more in the development of law business and ethical management. As we know that we spend more time in office every day, creating convenience and respectful place to work is a must because it will directly influence people's behavior socially. I also have a passion in writing and hope to write a book to share my idea about ethical business and social issue with many others. My love for children and education is also driving my plan to building a kindergarten or pre-school in the future, so I can educate the young generation with what I have learnt at t early ages.

The Bloomberg Startup Scholarship is offered to high achieving, needs-based students to help in the cost of attending top colleges and universities.

The scholarship will award up to \$5,000 USD per year to high-achieving students affiliated with JA, who plan to attend university, vocational or polytechnic school anywhere across the globe no later than January 2018.

The program is open for applications from January 2017 through March 2, 2017. As part of the application, students will provide the contact information for their JA local office, who will receive an electronic link to submit their nomination. The application process closes on March 2nd and the students will be notified in late April.

- Current JA students or JA Alumni
- Are in the final year of upper (higher) secondary school
- Plan to enroll in full-time undergraduate study at university, vocational or polytechnic school no later than January 2018



An Interview with Garrick Lau

JA AP: Please share with us your journey like to get to where you are as the Deputy CEO for JA Hong Kong.

Garrick: I first started volunteering for JAHK in 2014, when my previous employer was sponsoring JAHK's program in work readiness. At that time, I was also trying to figure out how I could utilize my experience on business and talent development to help local youth. JAHK naturally became my invaluable learning platform, and gradually I got the chances to experience different JA programs and got "converted"! Then recently I decided to change my role to devote myself to youth development and am honored to be a part of the JA family.

JA AP: What do you enjoy outside of work?

Garrick: I enjoy having breakfast with my children! And spending the weekend with family doing nothing serious. Besides, I like to read about motivation and workplace happiness. My favorite writers include Daniel Pink, Adam Grant and Clayton Christensen. Also like to keep myself updated with local youth through mentorship programs and social enterprises.

JA AP: How do you see JA Hong Kong changing in two years, and how do you see yourself creating that change?

Garrick: Maybe too soon to give a thoughtful answer as I have joined for just a couple of weeks. Nevertheless, I foresee some of the perspectives that we would be paying attention to include:

- 1. How UX for all stakeholders can be optimized to enhance engagement
- 2. How we can continue to be a content provider, AND also strengthen our role as a collaborator and curator
- 3. How we continue to TEACH students what we know, while LEARNING WITH students on things we are not familiar with.

To figure out how we can approach these, I see myself having a lot of listening and learning through experience, with a discipline of asking the "why" of everything.

JA AP. If there is one thing you can change in this world, what would that be?


Garrick: Would like to see everyone in the world has the courage to define and pursue his / her authentic version of happiness.
