Message from Maziar Sabet, President and CEO, JA Asia Pacific




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The JA Story

HP held a virtual press briefing to announce the launch of the 2019 Sustainable Impact Report, with a special focus on progress and highlights from Asia. The event included a panel discussion joined by representatives from HP's NGO partners including Systemiq from Project Stop, JA Asia Pacific, and Asia-Europe Foundations. More than 10 Southeast Asia media joined the virtual press briefing via Zoom on June 25, 2020.



Representing JA Asia Pacific at the press briefing was Monique Wong, Senior Business Development Manager. At the briefing, Monique talked about JA's sustainability agenda and efforts to continue empowering youth with confidence, cultivatinge critical values and qualities, and equipping young people with the needed skillsets to thrive in the 21st century workplace. In addition, Monique shared her view on the role of education in increasing access to students from all backgrounds and diversities to create the leaders of the future we all want.

HP aims to open 20 Tech Hubs to provide technology and entrepreneurship skills training to 10,000 youth in underserved communities across Southeast Asia by the end of - 2020. JA Asia Pacific is currently engaging JA member to support HP in setting up Tech-Hubs in Indonesia and Malaysia, and is planning to extend the partnership to the Philippines, Vietnam, and Thailand.

JA Hong Kong



Wherever possible, we are connecting with students online with the help of a core of devoted volunteers. Therefore, the JA Company meetings are conducted remotely under the premise that regional and national competitions be conducted online. This is an informal gathering which enables the 39 individuals to gather virtually and learn from each other. JA Japan

Invited by Bloomberg Women's Buy-side Network (BWBN), 50 female students of Fukuoka Futaba High School joined the Virtual Mentorship Program on June 30th.



For the students, communicating in English regarding financial markets or buy-side was a bit challenging, but our mentors certainly helped. In addition, the students managed to ask several questions regarding women's career development in financial markets to their mentor, Ms. Geraldine Buckingham, Head of Blackrock APAC.

One of the students commented, "This program definitely made an impact on my career planning. I would like to improve my English skills more to fully understand the session. And someday, I would like to be a global talent like Geraldine."



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Highlights from JA Asia Pacific members

JA Korea

The spread of COVID-19 has brought many changes in our lives, but JA Korea's education and learning continue. With our strength in digital literacy education, we are gradually shifting toward non-face-to-face education using digital tools. For example, we have recently launched a "coding delivery" program, where students receive a "coding package", followed by instructors providing physical coding education in real time. JA Korea has also launched a work-readiness program online through Zoom.





JA Malaysia

JA Malaysia kicked off its first ever JA Malaysia Talk Series discussing the topic - Survived COVID 19! Mental Health in the New Normal and Rewiring Your Mind for the Future.

The discussion was led by guest speaker, Associate Professor Dr Anasuya Jegathevi Jegathesan, who is a licensed and registered counsellor and the Program Director of Psychology from Taylor University. This talk was attended by 150 participants who were interested in knowing more and seeking answers to their consciously curious minds. The virtual talk was also streamed live on Facebook.





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Highlights from JA Asia Pacific members

JA Singapore

10 teams from 10 countries - JA Singapore sits top alongside JA Greece and JA Slovakia in the Social Innovation Relay (SIR) Global Final Competition 2020.





Two second-year vocational students from the Institute of Technical Education (ITE) have emerged winners in the Social Innovation Relay (SIR) Global Final Competition 2020. ACCESS, the winning team, is a social enterprise that matches Youth with Autism (YWA) with mainstream employment to create a more inclusive workplace. Their unique model hires YWA directly and outsources them to companies. Their trained mentors provide support to the YWA on the job for up to one year and train the companies to deal with challenges. This increases the chances of longer YWA work retention. The pair also developed a prototype of a chat support application making use of emojis, to allow youth with autism to communicate their feelings easily to their mentors or work supervisors when facing challenges at work. The genesis of this idea came from having classmates and friends with autism, so they know first-hand the difficulties they face with finding mainstream employment.

JA Vietnam



With support from Samsung Vina Electronics Company in Vietnam and in collaboration with the Vietnamese Ministry of Education and Training, JA Vietnam launched the "Solve for Tomorrow 2020" competition in June 2020. Focusing on the topic of applied robotics in researching and developing solutions to address problems in various fields including education, the environment, and health, the nationwide competition is organized for secondary and high school students (from age 12 to age 18). Vietnamese students are encouraged to pay attention to local problems and harness their ideas to improve and solve existing issues in the community.
